Thank you for your interest in Stratford East's Young Technicians , a practical introductory course for 16-21-year-olds, run in partnership with <u>RADA</u> and <u>Backstage</u> <u>Niche</u>.

The 12-week programme offers participants the opportunity to develop practical skills in stage management, lighting and sound with industry professionals.

Previous participants have gone on to accept work experience at <u>White Light</u>, on our Young Company mainstage productions, and at other London venues.

The course aims to address the imbalance of underrepresented groups working in backstage theatre. We believe it's crucial to create opportunities for young people to engage with artists that culturally and socially represent them. As such, we will prioritise applications from underrepresented young people.

We hope this course will support the next generation of backstage professionals.

Stratford East


- The main entrance to the theatre has step-free access. On the ground level, there is a spacious foyer, wheelchair-accessible Box Office and toilets.
